
# FIRST READING

<sup>29</sup>When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the LORD. <sup>30</sup>When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him. <sup>31</sup>But Moses called to them; so Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and he spoke to them. <sup>32</sup>Afterward all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the LORD had given him on Mount Sinai.




# LORD'S PRAYER

**VICAR FOR NEXT YEAR**: We have the opportunity to have a vicar serve us again in fall. Our Seminary asked us to apply for a vicar. Our voters decided that we will, with the Council deciding on March 17 what level of financial support we can provide. We currently pay \$33,000 for the year (plus \$2000 for moving and mileage). We would like to offer at least \$30,000 for the coming year. There is currently about \$5000 in the restricted vicar fund. If you can give an offering over-and-above your regular church offerings, please designate it for **"Vicar Fund."** Any donations received by March 16 will be considered by the Council (though contributions can be made after that to fulfill our commitment). If there are extra donations, they will be held in the restricted fund, and we will apply again the following year.

### LUTHERAN SCHOLARSHIP GRANTING ORGANIZATION OF OHIO (LSGOO)

To date, we have been able to provide \$9,420 in scholarships from this program to preschool families needing additional assistance in the preschool year 2024-2025. If you are not taking advantage of this excellent opportunity to **redirect** a portion of your Ohio tax liability to our school's ministry, please check out <u>www.lsgoohio.org</u> or talk with Elden Betts, Don Lucas or Howard Wilch. Up to \$750/individual or \$1500 filing jointly can be directed to this program with a one-time or recurring payment (It's a State of Ohio tax credit not a deduction). So far this tax year we have donor collections of \$14,500 toward the Board of Education goal of \$30,000. Thank you - donors - with additional donors, we can meet this goal for the preschool year 2025-2026 or even exceed that goal! What a great program, and it **costs you nothing** and you are helping in our preschool's ministry to share the Word of God not only with these young children but in some cases with the parents as well.
